FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome to our Newsletter for Week 5 of Term 3. We find ourselves half way through this term which seems to have snuck up on us very quickly.

Next week we have swimming lessons with our Year 5 and Year 6 students each day. Please ensure that all forms are returned and that you speak with your class teacher if you have any questions. Our Reception students are heading off to learn about road safety and our Year 2 students are visiting the Museum and the Central Markets. It is wonderful for students to be able to enjoy a range of experiences as part of our learning program.

Our teachers are working with your children to find ways that we can celebrate the diverse cultures that we represent at Bethany Christian School. We want to continue to build cultural awareness and respect together. Each year level, including our ELC are exploring how we can celebrate together throughout Week 8 of this term. While we cannot hold large community events, we are still finding ways that our students can be impacted by each other and can share their learning. We will use a similar model to the one that we developed at the end of last year, to encourage year levels to present an experience for the rest of the school, from ELC through to Year 6. This way there is a meaningful opportunity for your child to create something worth sharing with others and also see how others bring a broad range of ideas and opportunities they can learn from. We will keep you updated as we develop this experience and I would encourage you to speak with your children about what they are learning as well as sharing your stories of your family culture.

Friday 10th September will continue as a Pupil Free day even though the Royal Adelaide Show has been cancelled. Staff have a professional learning day planned and so if you require care, OSHC will be open for bookings.

In the final two weeks of term we plan to hold our Parent Teacher Interviews in a similar format to Semester 1. We anticipate having one parent/caregiver attending per child and will use appropriate social distancing. You will also be asked to wear a face mask unless you have an exemption or need to remove it to communicate clearly. We will send home a booking link and ask you to choose which times you would like to book. These will be available in a couple of weeks for you. Interviews are held on Thursday 16th September and Tuesday 21st September.

20 things to notice in national parks, botanic gardens & other natural spaces


National parks, botanic gardens and other natural spaces are ideal places for our curiosity and imagination to run wild. See how many things you can notice in nature – you never know what you may find!

- 1 a tree hollow in a dead tree
- 2 a butterfly with orange, blue or black patterns (or a caterpillar)
- 3 circular patterns on a tree
- 4 grass heads that look like blowflies or a fluffy tail
- 5 dead branches in a living tree
- 6 moss growing on a tree stump
- 7 lichen growing on a fallen stick
- 8 a gum nut or other seed pod
- 9 a chewed leaf
- 10 animal scats/droppings
- 11 a yellow or white flower with an insect on it
- 12 fungi growing out of the ground or on a tree stump
- 13 an ant nest
- 14 a kangaroo, koala or other marsupial
- 15 tree sap on the trunk of a tree
- 16 a colourful parrot (e. Lorikeet or Rosella)
- 17 a feather
- 18 ants on the leaves of a gum tree
- 19 a bird's nest high in a tree
- 20 a sign to read.

We all play an important role in looking after nature – do your part by sticking to designated tracks, respecting wildlife and leaving things you find in their natural habitat. Whomever your adventures take you – we encourage you to learn about the Traditional Owners of the land and the role plants, animals and the landscape play in their cultural and spiritual beliefs.


25 things to do in Spring

- 1 Collect a flower to press, then place it between newspaper sheets and a layer of cardboard. Weigh it down with books and leave until your flower dries flat
- 2 Visit your local Stratico store for butterfly garden plants plus everything you need to establish them in your backyard. Their trained horticulturalists can help you select plants for caterpillars to eat such as Paper Daisies for the Painted Lady.
- 3 Set up a home nature display with your spring finds
- 4 Picnic by a wetland: watch waterbirds and listen for frogs, such as Spotted Marsh or Banjo frogs
- 5 Look for wildflowers near paths and gum trees at your local National Park (see if you can spot Donkey Spider, or Sun orchids)
- 6 Create a nature journal: draw or write about seasonal changes to plants and animals
- 7 Listen for male Koalas grunting from gum trees in the wild (it's their breeding season)
- 8 Make a mobile from natural items and hang it outdoors
- 9 Use a net and magnifying glass to see what you can scoop in a creek or wetland (put back what you find)
- 10 Walk along the beach to see how many white cuttlebones you can discover (cuttlefish have just finished breeding)
- 11 Bike ride somewhere new with family or friends
- 12 Attract wildlife to your garden by adding a birdbath, logs, or rocks (also known as a lizard lounge)
- 13 Book a campsite in a National Park or caravan park
- 14 Build (or buy) a native bee hotel for your garden (native bees don't make hives)
- 15 Collect fallen sticks and build a cubby or giant nest
- 16 Plant tomatoes, basil, cucumbers, or lettuce in a Stratico garden bed, pots, or recycled egg or milk cartons (check out your local Stratico store for gardening supplies)
- 17 Make a crown from sour sobs, lavender, or paper daisies
- 18 Celebrate National Threatened Species Day on 7 September by researching a local threatened species (such as Southern Brown Bandicoots or Yellow-tailed Black Cockatoos)
- 19 Look for coastal treasures washed up after a storm, like different shaped sponges, squid eggs, and shells
- 20 Create a potion using petals, pebbles, and other natural ingredients
- 21 Write a poem or story about how spring makes you feel
- 22 Adventure to a place you've never been such as a Reservoir, Botanic Garden, or forest
- 23 Visit a wetland, estuary, or lake to watch migratory shorebirds arriving from their 10,000 km journey from Siberia (try the Adelaide International Bird Sanctuary - Winatynatyni Pangkara)
- 24 Create a living teepee in your yard by digging sticks into the ground. Plant edible climbers at the base, such as peas or beans
- 25 Go on a regional road trip or spend a few days in the sunshine in a new wild place

** Choose flowers you recognise are safe, such as lavender, rose, and wattle. Whomever your adventures take you – we encourage you to learn about the Traditional Owners of the land and the role plants, animals, and the landscape play in their cultural and spiritual beliefs.*


