We would like to find a balance to protecting the health of staff and students with the wonderful benefits of having some ways for parents to participate and celebrate learning. We will ask for your help as we hold "Welcome Back" opportunities that will allow for safe and enjoyable ways to join together again.

Parent teacher interviews will be held on line again in the same way we did in Term 1 and we will send out an email sometime next week with the details of how to register and select a convenient time slot. Please arrive no earlier than 10 minutes prior to the Chapel and remember to walk directly to the Performing Arts Centre. At times, classes will have a special part to play, and those teachers will invite you to come along, if you are able, to enjoy this time. Each week we will have the upstairs seating open to allow for guests to attend and maintain a safe distance. As always, any visitors to the school are required to sign in at the administration office and walk directly to the Performing Arts Centre. We ask that you wear a face mask in the front office and all other times that you are inside and close to others. If you are able to socially distance, you can choose if a mask is required. Please consider the health of all members of our community in this decision. Teachers are currently working together on other opportunities that can be created to 'Welcome Back' parents. These opportunities will be varied in their timing, the kind of activities involved, and they will all be planned around sharing and connecting together in safe ways. The idea of a whole school gathering continues to pose significant challenges, so instead, we will find ways to welcome you back in smaller groups that will be enjoyable ways to gather and celebrate. We are looking forward to sharing more about these important events as the term continues.

It is Book Week which is always a lot of fun. I enjoyed reading a book with the ELC children this week as a part of the celebrations. This Friday is dress up day so remember to dress up as your favourite character or inspired by the theme 'dreaming with your eyes open'. DEPUTY'S CORNER

Bethany Christian School has commenced the use of the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC), which began with all of the teaching staff undertaking explicit training in the use of the KS:CPC programme.

The KS:CPC is a Department for Education responsibility under the South Australia Children and Young People (Safety) Act 2017 and the Child Protection in Schools, Early Childhood Education and Care Services policy to ensure that effective abuse prevention programs are implemented and that all children and young people have access to the approved child protection curriculum.

Although parent permission is not required under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020, we encourage you to seek further clarification in order to alleviate any concerns.

The KS:CPC is a child safety and respectful relationships curriculum developed collaboratively with child protection experts, teachers, educational leaders and other professionals.

The KS:CPC is divided into 5 documents specific to the age and year level of students, starting from age 3 and progressing to age 17+.

The KS:CPC is based on two main themes which are presented through topics and activities of increasing complexity. The two KS:CPC Themes are:

- Theme 1: We all have the right to be safe
- Theme 2: We can help ourselves to be safe by talking to people we trust.

The two KS:CPC Themes are explored through four Focus Areas, which are examined in growing complexity in accordance with the age of the students. The Focus Areas are:

- Focus Area 1: The right to be safe
- Focus Area 2: Relationships
- Focus Area 3: Recognising and reporting abuse
- Focus Area 4: Protective strategies

The activities are structured in a sequential nature and at an age and developmentally appropriate level covering a range of topics. The KS:CPC fits primarily within the Health and Physical Education learning area of the Australian Curriculum and is often incorporated across other learning areas.

Swimming

Camp Medication

Year 5s are having their camp in Week 8. The school will pack the medication that has been provided to the school. However, if your child is on any regular medication that needs to be administered in the evening, night or in the morning, please provide the medication along with a doctor's note by Friday Week 7. All medications including over the counter medication/herbal medications need to have a doctor's note.

Lost Property

The school's lost property baskets have been overflowing and we have noticed there are many jumpers and jackets with no names, or have previous students' names or the names have faded off. There is a basket full of water bottles and lunch boxes as well with no names on them. This week we learned about being responsible and doing things diligently. So, can you talk to your children about packing their things straight away after using them. Some other things you can do:

- Have little card on their bag to pack their things in to the bag at the end of recess, lunch and after school
- Having a demo at home on how to pack a bag
- Reward charts for coming home with every item that belongs to them
- If they take jumpers or jackets off, ask them to put them straight in their bags or tie it around their hips
- Please label all uniforms clearly whether it is new or secondhand
- Please do not send the children with valuables such as gold rings, gold ear rings, watches or any other toys that are dear to them

Spare Uniform Information

Students at Bethany Christian School can borrow spare uniform when there is a need. Once uniforms are borrowed, it will be borrowed under the library's borrowing system. This system will send a reminder email to parents if the uniform has not been returned before the due date. After two scheduled reminders the Library will forward the student's details to the Finance department where the price of the uniform will be invoiced and added to your school fees to replace the spare uniform stock. Thank you for your support and cooperation.

Pick Ups during Recess and Lunch

If you are picking up your children during lunch time which is 1pm to 1:40pm, please notify the school before 12:50pm, so we can notify the teacher to send the student down to the student desk ready for pick up. As it is student's and teacher's lunch time, they won't be in the classroom and it is really difficult to locate a student in the yard or playground during this time. We acknowledge emergency situations are exceptions and we are happy to help you.




JUMP ROPE FOR HEART
